But all my history with social clubs in the motorcycle community began and ended with the Weasels SC, a well-known drinking club loosely based in the Prescott area. She set me on the right path of discovery by telling me that each Social Club was unique and that each one wants to shine in its own light. Further, she wanted me to know that often Social Clubs are stigmatized as being groupies for the Motorcycle Clubs; sort of like an auxiliary. And, though social club members can be either men or women, the majority are still staffed by women.

My enlightenment started with Mz. Nae, and continued some 18 months later, with

Southern Breeze. I returned to the Unstoppable Divas SC to give my thanks in the form of an article. Thus my journey to tell the world about all the facets of our motorcycle community continues; with a very special tribute to this Social Club. In the seemingly male-dominated world of motorcycles, it's very hard to break free from the stereotypical, pre-conceived concept of what a Social Club is. However, I believe Unstoppable Divas SC Mother Chapter has done just that. They broke free and have become something very special indeed.

The Unstoppable Divas support the area Motorcycle Clubs of the state in which they reside, not just one club. But Unstoppable Divas SC is much more than that. This is a community-based organization that believes in empowering women.
